What is a year round course?

A year round course is a "Japan Walking Association" approved walking course that anyone can enjoy any time, year-round, with permanent stations set up at the start and the end. When walkers complete an official walking event or course, their walk may be recorded in official records. And depending on the amount of participations or the length of a walk, a walker may receive a commendation and a globally-shared hatpin or patch design

What is the Honobono Yu no Kuni Sekigane Hot Spring Year Round Course?

As a walking station, the Sekigane Hot Spring day-spa "Sekigane Yumeikan" provides Nordic pole rental services and stamps for people who have completed courses. The approximately 17 km circuit course is home to many wonderful sights, including wonderful nature spots like Otakisan Fudo Falls and Daisen Pond, cultural resources like Otakisan Jizoin Temple with its collection of nationally designated important cultural properties and Torikai Residence which is a prefectural designated cultural preserve, and the abandoned JNR Kurayoshi line tracks.

The long-used Sekigane Hot Spring is said to have first been developed 1,300 years ago, and boasts the most impressive history in the San'in Region. It is surrounded by bountiful natural scenery including Chugoku Region's tallest peak Mt. Daisen to the West and the Hiruzen Sanza mountain scape to the south.

Spring Quality: Simple radioactive therapy spring (low tonicity, mildly alkalescent hot spring)

Colorless, clear, tasteless, and odorless hot springs are often called "Shirogane no Yu" (platinum springs) due to their absolutely unique beauty. They are also prominent on a global scale for their radium content. It is said that when small amounts of radium enter the body, cells are stimulated, metabolism is enhanced, and immunity strength and natural healing factors increase. Through the process of detoxifying excess radical oxygen, spring users can benefit from prevention and healing effects against lifestyle related diseases. These factors have led this spring to be selected as a "national recuperation hot spring area" in its role as a particularly superior restoration and healing hot spring area.

Recommended spots along the course



Otakisan Jizoin Temple

A Buddhist temple said to be founded by the Bodhisattva Gyoki in 756, it is lovingly known under the nickname "Seki no Jizosan" (The Jizo of Seki). The "Wooden Jizo Bodhisattva in Half-Lotus Position Statue" enshrined in Jizodo Hall here is a vosegi-zukuri work (a wooden sculpture made from nultiple wood pieces) 3.4 meters tall, and has been designated as an Important National Cultural Property.



Enmeichaya Foot Bath This is a foot bath along the upward slope from Eguimo Shinsui Park heading to Kamei Park and Otakisan Jizoin Temple. There are also tables and benches here, making this area perfect as a resting spot to assuage tired feet after walking through the Sekigane Hot Spring Area.

Eastern Daisen Torii Gate In the days of old when Mt. Daisen mountain worship flourished, the east of Mt. Daisen saw multitudes flocking along the "Kawadoko-michi" throughway to pray here. This "Eastern Torii Gate" was erected to function as the entrance to the shrine approach path. As you pass through the torii gate, you can enjoy the view of Mt. Daisen.

Torikai Residence

This is the residence of the village head that was originally located at the large Sekigane torii gate, and is thought to have been built in the mid-Edo Period. It was dismantled and reconstructed and moved to its current location in 1991, and was restored to its original mid-Edo Period form based on the dismantling inspection undertook at that time.

Otakisan Kannondo & Fudo Falls Kannondo is a place of worship within the Otakisan Jizoin Temple grounds About one hundred meters away are the Fudo Falls, a place that is said to have served as a place

of spiritual training for monks of the past. Water plummeting powerfully from amidst the verdant masses of trees has a holy feel
